His B-24 Was Shot Down by German Fighters

SSgt Thomas H. Harwood, 24, B-24 gunner, Tech High graduate as drowned in the English Channel April 23 when his plane was shot down by the German fighters, according to word form the War Department by his parents. Mr. and Mrs. James Harvey Harwood, 2063 Carr.

He has been overseas since November 28, 1943. SSgt Harwood completed 19 missions with the Eighth Air Force and had been awarded the Air Medal with three Oak Leaf Clusters.

He was employed by Fisher Aircraft Corporation prior to entry into the Army.
